HARD HAT TOUR AT MONROE SHOPS

Thursday, July 9 (6 to 8 p.m.)

Location—Meet at Illinois D.A.R.T. Station, 2111 South Corinth Street, Dallas, Texas 75203

Monroe Shops was built in 1914 as a facility for the Texas Electric Railway to repair, maintain, and build Interurban trolley cars. D.A.R.T. is currently renovating the N.R.H.P.-listed building as the D.A.R.T. Police Headquarters. The renovation, which is also attempting LEED Silver certification, will not only bring the building back to life after a long hiatus, but add sustainable value to the neighborhood, and return Monroe Shops to its original transportation mission.

THE INTERURBANS—THE ORIGINAL D.A.R.T. RAIL

Tom Petr will present an overview of early North Texas rail transportation and the man who orchestrated it all, J.F. Strickland. This impressive and most extensive system is the basis for Dallas' public transportation lines today.

LOST DALLAS

Join Mark Doty, Senior Planner with the City of Dallas, as he explores those beloved buildings and structures that were once part of the Dallas landscape and are no more. Famous buildings like the Dallas Cotton Exchange and the Dr. Pepper Headquarters will be highlighted, along with lesser known Downtown buildings, and structures such as the Comet Roller Coaster.

TURNING POINTS IN DALLAS HISTORY

THE RESURRECTION OF THE KESSLER THEATER HARD HAT TOUR

Owner Edwin Cabaniss and architect Richard Drummond Davis will unveil plans to bring Oak Cliff's beloved Kessler Theater back to life. A sensation for its time, this rare example of the Art Deco theater was owned and operated by Gene Autry in the years following World War II. Following the presentation, participants will take a hard hat tour of the complex—a rare opportunity before the building closes for renovations.
